# PUTTING SOMETHING BACK

Those who have risen to the professional ranks from the youth and club structure in Devon seem ever willing to try and give something back. Jack Davey, a leading figure in the David Shepherd Cricket Foundation attended Tavistock Grammar School and played for his local village side Milton Abbot before representing Devon and eventually moving on to Gloucestershire from 1966 to 1978. Matt Wood followed Chris Read to Notts via Somerset and is now involved with some of the age group teams and EPP. The Overton twins, Craig and Jamie, who have recently made their way into the professional ranks at Somerset as well as the England Development set up, have willingly given their time to supporting fund raising and awards evenings. Lewis Gregory and Adam Dibble have helped regularly over a number of years.

Difficult then to pick any one person for special mention, but I am going to do just that. Chris Read played for Devon at each of the county youth age groups and the Devon Minor Counties side before joining the professional ranks at Gloucestershire and eventually Nottinghamshire. He is currently captain at Trent Bridge having guided them to the county championship title in 2010 and the YB40 title at Lords in 2013 (where he was the games top scorer with a crucial 50)

His credentials as a cricketer are of course never in doubt, 15 tests (which should have been many more but for the poor judgement of Duncan Fletcher), 36 ODIs, over 13000 first class runs plus 863 catches and 47 stumpings in first class matches alone! However it is as a thoroughly decent individual that he has endeared himself to the cricket family in Devon. I have had the pleasure of aetting to know him better since he agreed to become patron of Devon Youth Cricket Foundation.

Here, despite a busy schedule as captain of a first class county, he has always responded to requests for help, often causing him to make the journey from Nottingham to Devon. I am far from alone in admiring his willingness to put something back into the youth structure which encouraged and nourished his early involvement in cricket.

He has been one of the coaches on each of the two previous tours to South Africa. Ask any of the players and they will tell you how much they benefited from his knowledgeable and enthusiastic input. Even to the point of working over the lunch break with those not playing in that game and arranging one to one chats with each of the players at the end of the tour.



No wonder we are delighted that he will be part of the 2014 tour.

# THE BUILDING BLOCKS ARE IN PLACE

#### A LOOK BACK AT THE 2013 SEASON

The hard work put in by all the players and coaches during the winter squad sessions was a great benefit in preparing for the 2013 season.

The season had its ups and downs but overall it was a definite improvement on the previous year when the fixtures were decimated by wet weather.

We started off with a game against Gwent which we won emphatically with great batting performances from Harvey Sargent 91\*, a debut hundred from Noah Wright 104\*, who together posted a 178 run partnership. I added a 50 and we racked up 276, not bad for a first innings. Our bowlers had a field day and we beat Gwent comfortably by 171 runs, bowling them out cheaply for 105.

Unfortunately we couldn't repeat the success the very next week against Berkshire. Some of our batters got starts but couldn't carry on and we ended up with a disappointing 178-7 on a flat wicket. Our bowlers tried to claw it back after such a poor start but Berkshire eventually ran out winners by four wickets.

However, I think we have become better at bouncing back and this we did beating Cornwall by 40 runs with good performances from Harvey Sargent 98 and some hard hitting from Neil Osborne 48\*. We weren't as fortunate in the next two games, losing consecutively to Dorset, whom I felt we should have beaten, and Somerset more convincingly. In the Dorset game we set them a target of 201 with Harvey continuing his consistent form with 61. Despite some economical overs from Billy Rudolph we could not restrict them and slumped to a disappointing 2-wicket loss. However the following game was not so close as Somerset won by a margin of 135 runs.

A week to forgot and to move on from as quickly as possible.

On to Taunton for what would be our last festival.

Having got off to a bad start by losing to Derbyshire and Wales (this despite Matt Petherbridge taking three wickets with his first three balls!) we salvaged a draw from a tough game against Yorkshire Ben Phillips contributing a valuable 50).

We completed the festival in style with victories over Worcestershire by five wickets (Finlay Marks 54 and Harvey Sargent 59) and finally a comprehensive win over Gloucestershire by six wickets. We bowled them out cheaply for 118 with great figures from Billy Rudolph 9-0-32-4 and knocked off the runs comfortably. A great way to end our festival finishing fourth in our group

On returning to league action the next two games were called off due to rain, the only matches to suffer this fate in what was a great season weather-wise. Our next league encounter was away to Hampshire which we knew would be a tough test. A disappointing bowling effort saw Hampshire post a target of 286 after ten bowlers were used. In the chase Noah Wright contributed 52\* but we lost wickets regularly, something which invariably happens when chasing such a big target. and ended up losing comprehensively by 103 runs.

Once again we bounced back and finished our season on a high against a familiar opponents in Gloucestershire. We restricted them to 172 all out and chased down the target comfortably losing only one wicket in the process. A match winning partnership between Billy Rudolph 58\* and myself 56\* was a great way to end the season!

Overall 2013 was a much better season than the previous year with lovely weather ensuring we played 12 matches. Of these 5 were won, 6 ended in defeat and1 game ended in a draw.

The building blocks are in place for a great tour of South Africa!

# **CRICKET IN THE TOWNSHIPS -THE SIGNS ARE ENCOURAGING**

Those who went on the first tour in 2002 will recall the match at Langa against Western Province Development X1, a team selected from township areas in and around Cape Town. They will certainly remember the deluge of exuberant young children who, on finishing school, invaded the local cricket ground, a completely unexpected and unfamiliar event for players and staff alike. Not that it was in any way threatening or unpleasant, guite the opposite in fact. It was simply our first experience of the vibrant social structure that underpins life in a township. We were here to take part in a cricket match but there was no escaping the welcoming attentions of the children who simply wanted to meet their visitors and be involved in what was going on.

That we won the cricket match was incidental. After the game we were invited to the township and had the privilege of meeting residents in their homes.

The experience had quite an impact on all the boys



We gave one lady 50 Rand for welcoming us into her house, she immediately burst into tears and went to hide the money. The look on the face of that woman and the joy on in the eyes of the children at the cricket match is something that I shall never forget.

Historically the black population did not play the game in any great numbers, in some places not at all. However we have witnessed a considerable improvement in the quality of these players in matches over the twelve years that we have been touring. The success is testament to the foresight of those who initiated and planned the project and a reflection of the skill and dedication of the coaches and organisers who implemented the ideas.

Much of this valuable work has been organized and supervised by Ezra Cagwe. Development Cricket Coordinator at Western Province Cricket Association. a delightful character we have met up with on each of our visits.

Having an understanding of how to teach cricket is one thing, selling the game to a population who had virtually no understanding or attachment to the sport is something else. Enormous credit then to Ezra and his increasing band of coaches, twelve at the last count. From virtually nothing in 2002 they have engaged the attention of children in the townships to the point where they now oversee squads at U10 and U11, drawn from forty two schools in nine township areas.

There is still much to do but the signs are encouraging.

# THE NEXT NTINI?

Over the years we have managed to attract additional funding from people who recognise the benefit of giving a little back to the communities who have so generously hosted our young players.

We have run several courses for teachers and children from the rural areas in Mpumalanga, provided kit for developing clubs and schools in Cape Town and helped to finance part of the continuing education costs for a few talented young cricketers who might otherwise have been lost to the game.

Our game in 2013 against a Development XI introduced us to Thandani Nyombolo a very promising quick bowler from Khayelitsha. Having been introduced to cricket via U9 mini cricket he maintained an interest in the game and eventually joined the local club.

While the academic aspect of his education was well catered for in later years, the fact that that his school did not major in cricket was an issue for a young man of promise who was keen to learn more about the game

Paul Adams, former South Africa test player and now coach to Cape Cobras expressed the opinion that Thandani might have the potential to become a future Cobras player. However it seemed unlikely that his mother would be able to raise sufficient money for him to attend a school where cricket was a major part of the sporting curriculum. Efforts were made to help and Ezra Cagwe made us aware of this during our visit in 2013. We could not fund the placing in its entirety but offered to make a donation. Suffice to say that this enabled him to secure a place at Western Cape Sports School and it is encouraging to hear that he has recently been selected for Western Province at Under 17.

Naturally we were delighted to help make this happen and Thandani and his mother were extremely grateful. I guess the real bonus would be if he became the next Makhaya Ntini, but please, not at the expense of England!

The standard of youth cricket is exceptionally high. They receive so much satisfaction and joy from playing a game of cricket, making the matches more competitive than in England. We competed very well in every game we played and we needed to because team spirit is prevalent everywhere in South Africa.

Kruger was a great place to visit especially because of the people who hosted us, their fantastic hospitality ensured we did everything we possibly could in the short period of time we were there, including a meal in the bush at night – amazing. The cricket we played at Skukuza CC and everything we saw or heard, including the most spectacular electric storm on our last night left us with fantastic memories.

Kruger really was awesome! The early mornings (and I mean early) and evening safaris were a fantastic opportunity and seeing such powerful wild animals from such a close distance is incredible. Cape Town is a most spectacular city to visit. The standard of cricket in Cape Town was generally very high however as a team we still played and competed extremely well. Conditions in Paarl were 40°C – unbelievably hot to be playing cricket in. Playing against Western Province U15s on our last full day in South Africa was a great experience as they were an excellent side and really put us through our paces. Also winning in the last over against the Southern Suburbs was incredible thanks to Greener for hitting 18 in the last over!

# AN EXPERIENCE NONE OF US WILL EVER FORGET

Club cricketer and a leading figure of the Devon Cricket League Umpires Panel, David Moseby, was invited to travel as a member of the group and officiate on the 18 day Devon Cricket Board Development Tour of South Africa in February. Here David relives his experiences:-

I was approached By Gavin Lane (DACO) about the possibility of joining the 2013 tour I knew Mark Orchard (Brixham CC) had gone on an earlier tour and after speaking to Mark and his father, Barry, who went with the party in 2005, I decided to go. What a fantastic decision, an eighteen day trip never to be forgotten.

We set off from Heathrow to Johannesburg- on February 14 (my wife said leaving her alone for 18 days was the best Valentines Day present I had ever given her!!!) with 14 boys and 14 players and 5 staff in the party. We met Chris Read at Heathrow (what a privilege for the boys to have an international cricketer as a coach for the whole tour) and Alan Swift, tour manager, linked up with us in South Africa. Alan was the mastermind of the tour and the contacts he had made gave us access to places that money just could not buy.

Our first seven days were spent in the Kruger Gate Hotel - a luxury hotel within a guarter of a mile from the entrance to the Kruger National Park Our cricket base was Skukuza Cricket club, a fantastic club and ground situated in the staff village. Skukuza. the administrative centre of the Kruger National Park

The boys played two games there (a one day and a two day) and did brilliantly to win both. They were played in temperatures of around 38 degrees (quite warm really). Our hosts looked after us magnificently and eating bush braais in the wild in the evenings was an amazing experience. We were privileged to go on wonderful game drives and our guide. named Letters, knew the Park inside out. With his knowledge and contacts he took us to places where he knew the big five were. Some of the highlights:-

- Having to slow down as a leopard ran across the road in front of our jeep
- Seeing a family of rhino walk across the road in front of us
- · Crossing a bridge and seeing crocodiles and hippos in the river
- · Seeing an elephant bathing in the river
- A leopard curled up in a tree
- · Giraffes regularly at the roadside

But THE highlight was a lion and a lioness sat on the road (having a romantic evening). We parked and watched them from less than ten vards away for around twenty minutes - wow!

Surreal moment was being woken up at 6.30 am one morning by a massive bang - looking out of my hotel window to see a security guy shooting at an invading troop of baboons - two of whom stole toast from the next breakfast table later that morning.

Then a wonderful flight down to Cape Town, where we would spend the next nine nights. Four games of cricket were played here:-

- A day night game under floodlights against a team from Townships- which Devon won by one wicket in the last over.
- · A one day game against Boland at Paarl, a beautiful ground, which has hosted one day internationals - a game played in heat of 42 degrees
- · Two games against Western Provinceone at the attractive Vineyard Oval.Devon lost the last three games but the opposition was strong and a tour record of won 3 lost 3 was a successful record the boys.

Cape Town is the most beautiful place I have ever visited, the best bits:-

- An evening cable car ride to see sunset on Table Mountain – wow
- A boat trip out to Robben Island to see where Nelson Mandela was held.
- A trip to Boulders Beach to see literally thousands of penguins, who swam right up to you.

- · A drive through the Township of Langa a reality check to be sure.
- Evenings on the Waterfront, eating at sensational outdoor restaurants, sampling freshly caught fish with fantastic bands and singers playing on every corner.
- A trip to Newlands, sitting in the President's box watching a twenty 20 won by the Cape Cobras.
- Trips to fantastic beaches, with the back drop of Table Mountain

The whole trip had been a great success. The cricket fixtures were designed to test the boys and they responded superbly. Chris Read, Tim Ward and Matt Cooke were superb coaches, organising productive practice sessions on arrival in South Africa and excellent team and individual coaching on all match days.

The boys were ably led by skipper, Ben Steer, and it was a pleasure to be on the field for every minute of the tour to see them grow in confidence, individually and as a group and show great team spirit throughout.

A large group of parents travelled and gave wonderful support to the boys at every match. The tour party and parents got together and had a fantastic last night in Cape Town. As ever the time to fly home seemed to arrive quickly after such a great adventure. It was a privilege for me to be part of the tour party -

an experience none of us will ever forget.


