As the 2017 season now feels like a distant memory, it's good to remind ourselves how well we actually did last year. This is great for giving us confidence going forwards as we now start our intensive training and the excitement builds towards playing in South Africa in February 2018. The boys thank Sam and Nigel for supporting and preparing us throughout last season and into the next.



Our first game was a friendly against Gwent. Highlights were Baker and Ingham-Hill taking 3 wickets each, Tyson batting through, and we won, getting the opposition all out for 89. We won by 7 wickets. A great way to start the season.



We crashed quickly in our first serious game, being beaten by Berkshire in a disappointing defeat. We did well to restrict Berkshire to 157 for 9, but Devon gained only 114 all out. This was a good bowling and fielding performance as was often the case; however, let down by a poor batting performance on this occasion. Ward and Baker were the pick of the bowlers that day.

Picking ourselves up, we then went on to beat Wiltshire by 10 runs at Bovey Tracey, Highlights were Tyson scoring 55 runs, Taylor taking 3 wickets and Reynolds (Blondie) holding his nerve when bowling in the last over to a win a thriller. Important runs from Rudolph and Hurst seeing the score to 190 for 9, in the end, proved vital.

Up next was Hampshire, played at Blundell's, which sadly saw us all out for 169 with 5 overs left to play. versus their total of 209. Hamilton was returning from a collar bone break and Reynolds again played well, getting 43 runs.

The Gloucester match was played on a poor wicket at Colston's Grammar School, Hurst took 3 wickets and Fordy, 4 wickets, restricting Gloucestershire to 123 all out as a team and Hamilton seeing us home with 24 runs not out.



Next up in the Championship was Oxfordshire, who were flying high at the time having lost just once and they looked like a very good outfit cruising to nearly 100 for the loss of just one wicket. However, this game was to turn on its head with a season's best bowling figures from Farley's leg spin (6-34), good glove work from Small and Jefferson wrapping them up for 111 all out, were some of the highlights. We knocked off the runs winning with the score 112 for 2.

Then came the King's festival.

The Derbyshire match was great, with us getting them all out for 84. Ren Dog did well with a score of



52 not out (his maiden county 50) bringing us an 8-wicket victory.

Buckinghamshire scored 189 batting first with Tay chipping in with 4 wickets. Then we produced our best batting performance of the week, with Hurst scoring 30, myself 57, Hamilton scoring 59 and winning in 28 overs.

Gloucestershire was our third match and they scored 135 all out, versus our 62 reply, although Ingham-Hill took a great 3 wickets again. A disappointing result for us having beaten them earlier in the season.

However, we came together the next day to produce a thrilling game with Shropshire who won when scoring 117 for 9 - so just a one wicket loss for us. Baker took an amazing hat trick and got his name on the board with a five-for; kissing the ground in celebration! Had we won this game we would have actually won the tournament in what proved to be a tight table.

We had our last opportunity to win grabbed from us as the final game was abandoned versus Middlesex due to poor weather, only to finish King's mid-table therefore.

As well as Sam and Nigel, the boys thank Clemmo for helping them through the King's week.

Back to the Championship, versus Somerset, Devon struggled to 165 all out (Elliot scoring a gritty 58). It

didn't look enough against a strong unbeaten Somerset side. However, not for the first time, the bowlers and sharp fielding saved us,

bowling them out for 118, which was a great win with probably our best performance in the field out of the whole year.

The Cornwall game was our penultimate cup game. Devon beat Cornwall by 135 runs, which confirmed qualification to the top division for 2018. This was to be our finest batting performance of the season. Ford achieved a great score of 74 with a maiden county 50 and I scored 84 at a run a ball. Beaumont hit 2 big 6s in his 34 runs. The overall score went past 300 on a poor wicket. Farley took 4 wickets and Fordy, a further 3 to wrap up a comprehensive victory.

Dorset was our final game to finish the season and we won. It gave Baker a career best of 6-17 and an overall 7 wicket victory. We came 2nd in the table behind Berkshire by only a point.

Taking the season as a whole, we won 9 games, lost 4, with one abandoned.

Bowling performances were excellent throughout the season and we often bowled teams out for low scores. Occasionally our batting let us down, however, we have shown we can post big scores and compete when we put it all together.

We feel we have the opportunity to emulate the previous U15 team by topping our group next season and competing successfully in South Africa.



Our Hosts

Since the first Devon Cricket Development tour in 2002, over 200 young cricketers from Devon have visited South Africa and, judging by the very positive feedback, have derived great benefit from the experience. There is little doubt that the opportunity to play against capable and competitive opponents in unfamiliar circumstance has contributed to their cricket education.



However, while cricket development is the principal reason for travelling 6,000 miles, it would be wrong to measure all the benefits purely in terms of runs

scored, wickets taken and matches won or lost. South Africa is a strikingly beautiful country with sharply contrasting landscapes. While Kruger provides the classic Africa with wonderful wildlife, Cape Town is a vibrant, modern city but with the dramatic background of Table Mountain to remind you that you are visiting somewhere rather different and special.

While the contrasting beauty is obviously appealing,

it is the human rather than the physical geography which many find more interesting. Those who have

made several visits over the last twenty years will almost certainly bear witness to South Africa as a country now emerging, sometimes painfully, from a troubled history.



How you might ask, does the tour provide our young travellers with a more general educational experience to that provided through visiting as part of a packaged tour through travel companies?

The answer to such a question requires recognition of the relationships built up over the years with capable and generous people in Kruger and the Western Cape, people who have become good friends of Devon Cricket. It is through their generosity and help that our young visitors have the opportunity to meet people from contrasting backgrounds and cultural differences as well as gaining access to places of interest usually 'off limit' to tourists.

Frik Rossouw is a senior investigator with SAN Parks Special Projects; the Kruger National Park is home to the world's single largest population of



rhinoceros and Frik is in the front line of the ongoing challenge to curb the illegal poaching of rhino there. However, it is through his work as 'Mr Cricket' at Skukuza Cricket Club, a lovely ground uniquely situated within the

wildlife park, that we have got to know him so well. Without his generous support the rather special experience we enjoy in Kruger would not happen.

Head Teacher at Skukuza Primary School, Jannie Geldenhuys has been a feature of our visits to

Kruger since the first tour in 2002. Indeed on our second visit he acted as a guide on an evening game drive. He is very much involved in school sport in Mpumalanga Province, including athletics and of course cricket.



Executive of Western Province Cricket Association and

we are incredibly grateful for his continuing support and involvement in the tour.

Michelle Ernnstzen, a delightful and capable lady who is PA for Nabeal at Newlands. She has a good working




'Mr Fixit', **Shaheem** has organised our transport in and around Cape Town for every tour. A lively

and very likeable character, he spent some years teaching at secondary level in Cape Town and is fondly remembered by all boys who have been on the tour. To the tour management, he is



much more than simply the transport man, as he is full of ideas and appears to know everyone and everything that is happening in Cape Town. A streetwise and caring individual, he helps ensure that the boys have an enjoyable and safe time.





Mutual Benefit

A by-product of the annual tour has been the emergence of a Development Exchange programme providing players (generally around the age of 19) from South Africa to play in Devon whilst players from Devon have spent part of the English winter playing cricket in the Western Province club league.

Of the current Cape Cobras contracted 22 man squad, 5 have had a season developing their cricket in the Devon League. In 2016, Kyle Verreynne, fresh from representing South Africa U19's and having played for Western Province U15's against Devon a few years earlier, came to play for North Devon Cricket Club in the Devon Premier League, finishing third highest run scorer in the league and scoring three centuries. Since his return to South Africa he has scored his maiden first class century for Western Province CC and broken into the Cape Cobras team. Jason Smith, who also came over to play in the Devon League as an 18 year old five years ago (and holds the record Devon Premier League opening partnership with Barney Huxtable), is currently a regular in the Cape Cobras team. J P Duminy, Vernon Philander and Beuran Hendricks have all gone on to represent South Africa after spending time playing in the Devon League as young adults.

In addition, young cricketers from Cape Town schools have been coming over to schools in Devon to further their cricket and academic development. Simon Weale, Headmaster of Shebbear College, adds "I first became aware of Devon's U15 tour to

South Africa when my son was fortunate enough to be picked in 2015. This was a wonderful experience for him and under Alan Swift's guidance he came back a more



resilient character and a better cricketer. As a result of the tour I was able to foster a link with Rondebosch High School and the Newlands Cricket Academy - two remarkable institutions that both help promote cricketing excellence in Cape Town. These exchanges can be arranged remarkably easily if people have the will to do so. As a result we have been able to welcome cricketers from both



schools to Shebbear (and to both North Devon and Hatherleigh CC's) and in January 2017 two Shebbear students undertook an eight week stint at Newlands. There is so much more to this experience than a cricket tour. The boys will be treated as guests rather than tourists and if their minds are open their lives will be changed forever."

In Cape Town this English winter, following in the footsteps of previous Devon players, James Burke and Max Curtis, Jack Dart and Tom Ansell are playing for clubs in Cape Town in the Western Province Cricket League. Both have represented Devon CCC in the Minor Counties Championship in 2017 and both are graduates of the tour.



The South Africa Development Tour 2017

After only one medical emergency on the flight from Heathrow to Johannesburg, thankfully not one of our team, we caught a 39 seater airplane to Skukuza airport in the Kruger National Park. Despite warnings from previous tourists, all 14 of us were blown away by the heat and humidity on arrival. I certainly struggled to comprehend how I was going to function in the heat; let alone try and run. Baggage reclaim had to have been one of the most personal services ever, when the sole baggage handler passed the bags to us by hand through a small door. We boarded the safari bus and continued our journey to the beautiful Kruger Gate Hotel, where we caught our first glimpses of South African wildlife.

All settled and "unpacked", we went to Skukuza Cricket Club for our first of many delicious meals cooked by Isabel and Petro. We were certainly well fed for our first game the next day, which saw us face



an academy side from the Nelspruit area. We were to take them on in a 35 over "warm up game". The South Africans won the toss and decided to see how our batsmen would cope in the heat first up. A strong opening partnership between Horler and

Kopparambil came to an end when they were both retired with the score on 61. Medlock began to accelerate the scoring with 2 sixes. Some characteristic



quick running saw him get to 38 before he too was retired. This platform allowed the middle order to play expansively and they scored on the whole at a run a ball or just over. Morison came to the crease in the 30th over and scored a very respectable 44 not out from 16 balls. Our innings finished on 207-3, meaning our opposition needed to score at a touch under 6 an over to win.

Simmons and Harford bowled the first overs of Devon's tour with Simmons removing both of the openers, who were caught by keeper, Hannam. Hancock replaced Simmons at the clubhouse end and took a further 4 wickets, getting a good amount of turn and bounce on the Skukuza wicket. Pugsley took 2 wickets and Nelspruit were bowled out for 108 after some tail-wagging from their lower order. Hancock finished with figures of 7-1-23-4 and

Simmons, 5-4-3-2. A good marker was set as we looked forward to our next game, The Battle of Kruger.

Our second game of the tour was a two-day game against Nelspruit School U15's. Devon won the toss and elected to bat first. We posted a score of 167 all out, with White scoring 31 at number 3 and Hannam 36 not out. As a team we were disappointed with our total as we felt we had underperformed. However, tidy opening spells from Simmons and Medlock saw Medlock pick up 3 wickets from his first spell. Hancock then came on again and took 4 wickets for the second game in succession. Medlock finished with figures of 9-4-15-4 and Hancock, 8.3-4-16-4. Nelspruit were all out for 55 making our first innings total look far more respectable.

night in Kruger with all of our hosts at the hotel, with the buffet being taken full advantage of by all and a fitting finale to a wonderful time in Kruger.

On arrival in Cape Town, we immediately saw the differences from Kruger. A cosmopolitan city with free use of all car horns!

District Six Guest House was our home for the stay in Cape Town with Brenda and our hosts making us most welcome. Our first evening in Cape Town was spent at the V&A Waterfront; a large shopping mall with lots of restaurants on the harbour front.

On the morning of our first full day in the city, we travelled to Newlands to see Western Province play Eastern Province. Two former Devon League players were on show, Hamza having played for Paignton and Verreynne for North Devon during their time in the UK.

We played at Bergyliet High School in a day/night

game that evening. Devon won the toss and elected to bat on a hard but green South African wicket.

Kopparambil opened the batting for the tourists, along with Hannam. At 26 for 2, Horler joined Kopparambil at the crease and together they forged our highest partnership of the tour, 97. Kopparambil fell for 58 and Horler made 43. Enter Morison, who timed the ball superbly, hitting 6 sixes and 6 fours in his score of 83. The highest individual score of the tour came at a cost to Morison's new bat, now only useful as fire wood. Kidd also impressed with a quick fire 23 off of 14 balls. We finished our innings on 260 all out, missing out on the last three balls.

Cape Town and took a short boat ride out to the Seal colony at Hout Bay where we saw over 300 seals. After lunch, we travelled to Boulders Beach and saw the wild African Penguins up close. After some interaction and a demonstration from an elderly local, we were assured cliff jumping was safe and we enjoyed swimming in the warmer Indian Ocean.

Our next game saw us take on Newlands Cricket High School at Green Point Track in the shadows of the Football World Cup Stadium. Devon lost the toss and were to field first. Moore and Horler opened the first innings but we came up against a talented spinner who took 5 Devon wickets. Medlock, Read and Morison all made it into

the twenties but only Kopparambil went further, falling 3 runs short of his half century. Hancock and Kopparambil shared a 10th wicket partnership of 49 to push our score to 195 all out, leaving us with a first innings deficit of 36 runs.

Western Province second innings saw their opening batsman/keeper hit an unbeaten score of 105. They

declared on 177-3 with the wickets going again to spinners, Hancock and Pugsley. We were set a total of 214 to win.

With 40 overs left in the day, we needed to score at just above 5 an over. The message from the coaches was to "go for it" but not to throw our wickets away. Opener, Kopparambil fell for an excellent 66 in the 28th over. This brought big hitter, Morison to the crease to join the already set,



Hannam. At this point, we needed 100 off 12 overs but with Morison mistiming one, the orders changed to "bat for the draw". Hannam made 36 before an excellent caught and bowled saw his departure. The South Africans brought out helmets and stationed 8 fielders around the bat. Horler and Hancock survived 6 hostile and intimidating overs and we finished 77 short of the target and therefore secured the draw. With the weather clear, we decided to go up Table Mountain after the game and spent three quarters of an hour watching the sunset and taking in the

breathtaking views. Memories of which will stay with us forever.

For our final rest day, we went to Blue Rock Water Sports Centre. Everyone enjoyed a



hilarious morning of kneeboarding and cliff jumping. After lots of initial failures, almost everyone



managed at least one lap of the course. Tour Manager and Scorer, Mark Ansell, top scored with his skis and outshone all the players with lap after lap of elegant

waterskiing. Everyone finished with aching arms, a small price to pay for the amount of fun that was had.

Our last day saw an early start for a team photo at Newlands before our game at The Vineyard Oval. Western Province U15's won the toss and chose to bat. With the history of this fixture entirely in Western Province's favour, we felt we had the quality to end their 16 year unbeaten run. The home side had



recruited big hitting Jono Bird, local prospect who has been working with South Africa U19's. Bird punished our bowling attack smashing 136 not out from 115 balls, some of his hits clearing the surrounding buildings. The wickets were shared between Hancock (3), Read (2) and Medlock (1) and



a sharp run out by Captain Moore. Western Province posted 327 from their 50 overs.

White and Read put on 20 for the first wicket, but at

75-5 our chances were looking slim. Enter Morison, who again batted with aggression scoring 62 off 49 balls and shared a partnership of 49 for the 9th wicket. We were eventually bowled out for 211 in the 44th over.

Our last evening was spent at Newlands Cricket Ground, where our hosts prepared a delicious BBQ. We were given free-reign of the ground and ate our dinner pitch side. The morning of our departure we got the chance to barter with locals at a market and



a final opportunity to catch some rays and go for a swim at the beach.

We would just like to thank all of our South African hosts who made us feel so
