Devon Cricket Development Tour to South Africa

I would like to start my introduction to the brochure for the 2019 tour to South Africa by recognising the enormous contribution that the tour's founder, Alan Swift has made to Devon Cricket. Not only did Alan create the tour, but he ran it every year for 15 years until 2016 as a volunteer - an extraordinary contribution to the development of young cricketers. Alan has built a superb network of supporters of the tour, both in Kruger and in Cape Town, to the extent that they consider it just as an important part of their cricket year as we do. As the 2019 touring party, we are some of the lucky beneficiaries of Alan's tireless work.



This is the third year that I shall be managing the tour, having stepped into Alan's shoes

to take it on for a few years. I have done so because I have seen first hand, both as a parent and as part of the tour management, what a wonderful opportunity this tour is for 14 Devon boys to develop both as cricketers and as people. The last 12 months have been especially exciting for the Tour - we have had our first graduates play for England in Test Matches, and not just one but two. Firstly, Craig Overton went on the 2017/18 Ashes Tour to Australia, where his first scalp in Test cricket was Australian captain and at the time world no.1 batsman, Steve Smith.

The second was Dominic Bess, who made his debut at Lords in the 2018 Test Series against Pakistan, where he also performed very well, scoring a half century and also taking his maiden Test wicket.

For both Craig and Dom, their first overseas representative tour was this Tour in 2009 and 2011



respectively. In addition to Craig and Dom, there are currently two other tour graduates in the Somerset CCC first team squad - Craig's twin brother, Jamie Overton and Lewis Gregory - as well as Tom Lammonby and Ben Green knocking on the door of that squad. All of them will tell you what a significant part of their cricket development the tour to South Africa was.

Thank you to all of you who have made a contribution towards the tour, either by sponsorship or volunteering and to the rest of the tour coaching and management party - Jim Parker, Nigel Ashplant, Paul Heard and Kat Hampton. I would also like to say particular thanks to Chris Gregson, father of 2016 tour captain, James, who very kindly gives up his time as a solicitor free of charge to put together the Affidavits required by the South African Government for the boys to travel without their parents.

I hope we can make it another great tour to remember.

Don't be too insular, either as an individual or a group. Take the opportunity to talk to people you meet and gain some insight into their way of life and the contrasting cultures. If you do, South Africa and its people will repay you with interest."

The Road to South Africa 2019

Reflections on Devon U14s 2018 Season



The 2018 season saw us play some of our best cricket and make huge progress in our

development as a team. The season was also full of the usual drama, ups and downs and near misses that have been part of this squad's journey through the Devon age groups. This year the squad welcomed two new players, James Rowe and Ethan Carlisle who added some extra pace and variation in our bowling options. New coach, Tim Ward and new manager, Jim Parker helped us work harder and play harder.

After some good indoor sessions in our winter training, our first outdoor match was a 'friendly' against last year's South Africa tourists, the Devon Under 15s.

Unfortunately the game was abandoned after 17 overs on a very wet and miserable May morning at Barton Cricket Club – no signs of the long, dry summer that was to come!

Then it was on to Shobrooke Park for our first ECB County Cup match against



Somerset. I lost the toss - something that would become a bit of a habit over the season – and we were put into bat. Thanks to James Hayter (58), Ciaran Gray (39) and Sam Russell with some big hitting (23 off 14 balls), we made 199 for 8 from our 50 overs. We were pleased at posting a competitive total against a strong side but despite a

couple of early breakthroughs, the Somerset batsmen took advantage of an improving batting surface to reach our total with 13 overs to spare.

Our next game was at Seaton against Berkshire and after losing the toss Berkshire put us into bat. We made 174 for 8 – James Hayter 44, Sammy Broomhead 22 not out and myself 29 – the notable contributions with the bat.

Unfortunately we let ourselves down in the field with the exception of our off spinners, Rory Medlock (10 overs 2 for 29) and Tom Hatton (10 overs 1 for 27. Berkshire took full advantage to win by 7 wickets.



We then travelled to Marlborough to play Wiltshire. Wiltshire won the toss and elected to bat and after the disappointing bowling and fielding displays so far we were determined to improve. This we did,

bowling very well with the new ball - Archie Farkins (2 for 14) and Ethan Carlisle (4 for 36). Wiltshire ended their 50 overs on 184 for 9. We started our reply well with Ciaran Gray 25 and James Hayter making 63 but then had a batting collapse losing four quick wickets from which we never really recovered. Despite Sammy Broomhead and Sam Russell reaching double figures we fell 14 runs short.



Our next match was against Hampshire at Lymington. Another hot, sunny day and another toss lost. Hampshire

decided to bat and were heading for a very large total when a brilliant run out and four quick wickets wrapped up their innings on

211 with 7 overs to spare. Following tea, we started very well putting on 62 for the first wicket but then lost some quick wickets to their spinners leaving us on 70 for 3. Josh Couch and myself fought back but then Josh fell on 27 to leave us 117 for 4. Sam Russell then joined me and together we put on 92 runs - mainly from Sam's big hitting - he scored 59 from just 36 balls.

Unfortunately Sam was run out with us needing just 3 more runs but he had done enough. A few balls later I hit the winning runs and we had won our first match of the season by 5 wickets with 7 overs to spare. Coming just before the King's festival it was a great boost for the team.

Our recent record at King's was not great - a losing draw against Stithians and a winning draw against Hampshire had been our only real 'successes' since a solitary win against Buckinghamshire in the U11s

Festival. However, we arrived in Taunton full of confidence after our performance against Hampshire and were looking forward to the week. There were two changes to the squad with Reuben Windley joining the team and Jason Degg coming in as coach for the week.

Our first match was against Derbyshire and I won the toss, electing to bat first on what looked like a good pitch. Despite losing a couple of early wickets, a solid 57 from Archie Farkins and some crucial runs down the order from Sam (26), Sammy (19) and Tom Hatton (20) took us to a good score of 215 all out from our 50 overs. We then produced an excellent team performance in the field bowling very well. Rory 3 for 15, and 2 wickets apiece for Josh, Tom and myself helped us to bowl Derbyshire out for 145 in 41 overs - a great team effort and a brilliant start to the week.

Next up was Buckinghamshire. We won the toss and batted first. Joe Farmer made an excellent 89 not out, and with good contributions from Ciaran Gray (38), Reuben (25) and Sam (22), we reached 216 for 8 in our 50 overs.

Buckinghamshire started their innings well, making 170 for 4 and looking set to reach our



total, however some great fielding and bowling including three run outs and Ethan Carlisle finishing with 3 for 22 off his 10 overs, meant Buckinghamshire were bowled out for 197 in 48.4 overs. We had won our second match by 19 runs! Devon in dreamland and top of our group!

We now faced Gloucestershire, who were

second in the group. I lost the toss and Gloucestershire decided to bat. They were 187 for 5 but some good bowling from Rory (3 for 41), Tom (2 for 33) and myself (2 for 22), turned the game around. Then two dramatic run outs from Oli Smith meant we had bowled Gloucestershire out for 203 in 42.3 overs. Game on! We made a shaky start and recovered from 17 for 2 to reach 71 for 3 with Ciaran Gray making another solid thirty. We had quietened the rowdy Gloucestershire players and were batting well. I reached my fifty with the team on 154 for 5 and it was looking like we could chase down their total. We had enough overs (having gained the additional overs for bowling them out within their 50 overs) and I was still there on 60 not out. Unfortunately we then managed to snatch defeat from the jaws of victory as we slipped from 171 for 6 to 173 all out. We were gutted to lose a game we felt we should and could have won. This was an indication of how much our confidence had grown and how much we had improved, that we were able to have come so close to pulling off a win against the strongest side in our group.

We then played Shropshire. I won the toss and decided to bat. Several batsmen got starts but no one was able to make a significant score. We finished on 173 all out from 47 overs. Reuben top scored with 31. Shropshire batted very well and were 119

for 3, then some quick breakthroughs saw them reduced to 138 for 6. Unfortunately we couldn't quite complete the comeback and Shropshire won by 3 wickets.

In our final game against Oxfordshire we were hoping to bounce back and finish the week on a high. I managed to win the toss again and we batted first. This time we took full

advantage with James Hayter making 82 not out, Sam Russell a brilliant 80 not out from just 47 balls,




and contributions from Ciaran Gray, 42 and 37 from myself. This took us to our highest ever team total - 259 for 3 from 45 overs. Oxfordshire started well in their reply reaching 86 without loss. An amazing catch from Tom Hatton, running in from the boundary off Josh's bowling broke the partnership. It wasn't long after that Josh took his second wicket and then a run out had Oxfordshire struggling. Despite some good fielding and bowling, including Rory (3 for 39), we couldn't quite restrict them to the 172 that would have given us the full win. Oxfordshire managed to limp to 178 for 7 in their 45 overs and claim the losing draw. It was an amazing week and finishing joint second in the group behind Gloucestershire had been a huge achievement for the team. Thank you to Jason Degg for his coaching and encouragement at King's and to the parents who supported and shared the drama, excitement, highs and lows of that week. We will carry those memories in particular, as encouragement with us to South Africa. We really bonded and grew as players and as a team at Taunton.

We hoped that the success at King's would

lead us to finish our ECB County Cup matches well... but it wasn't to be. A tough match at St Austell against a good Cornwall side finished with a narrow defeat. Having



won the toss Cornwall elected to bat. All six bowlers picked up wickets as we bowled Cornwall out for 188 in

their 50 overs. In reply, we again started well but fell from 41 for none to 70 for 7 - another fatal middle order collapse. Reuben (18), Tom (20) and Sammy (35) helped us fight back but we had left ourselves too much to do and in the 44th over we were bowled out for 161.

There was a still a lot of optimism looking ahead to our next fixtures - two very winnable games against Dorset and Oxfordshire, but the good weather that had been such a feature of our 2018 summer let us down and both these matches were lost to rain. So our final game was Gloucestershire at Exeter. Gloucestershire put us into bat. Archie top scored with 67 and Sam Russell made a typically brutal 38 including five massive sixes. Rory Medlock

and Charlie Presswell then made a valuable 35 run partnership for the last wicket to help us reach 207 from 48 overs. Despite a wicket apiece for Tom Hatton and James Rowe that had Gloucestershire 62 for 2, a convincing partnership of 144 by their number 3 and number 4 batsmen saw them home for the win with 4 overs to spare.

There had been many good performances and contributions over the season and 2018 had seen some of our best wins as a team. Sam Russell deservedly finished as our Player of the Year, with James Hayter picking up Batsman of the Year and Ethan Carlisle our Bowler of the Year.



We are all excited and looking forward to the

challenges and rewards our tour to South Africa will bring. As a team we know we can still improve further and this fantastic opportunity will give us experiences both on the field and off to do this. Thank you to Tim and Jim for their support and encouragement this year. Thanks to Sue Smith for scoring our matches and to all our parents and families for their support. We are all extremely grateful to our sponsors and everyone who is helping to fund our tour. I know we will try to represent you, our county and our country to the best we can in South Africa. I can guarantee that it will not be dull if last season is anything to go by!

How you might ask, does this tour provide our young travellers with a more general educational experience to that provided through visiting as part of a packaged tour through travel companies?

The answer to such a question requires recognition of the relationships built up over the years with capable and generous

people in Kruger and the Western Cape, people who have become good friends of Devon cricket. It is through their generosity and help that our young visitors have the opportunity to meet people from contrasting backgrounds and cultural differences as well as gaining access to places of interest usually 'off limit' to tourists.

The Kruger National Park

About the same size as Wales and the animals are truly wild, no manicured reserves here. Two husband and wife teams have been wonderful hosts for all our tours.



Frik Rossouw is a senior investigator with SAN Parks Special Projects; the Kruger National Park is home to the world's single largest population of

rhinoceros and Frik is in the front line of the ongoing challenge to curb the illegal poaching of rhino there. However it is through his work as 'Mr Cricket' at Skukuza Cricket Club, a lovely ground uniquely situated within the wildlife park, that we have got to know him so well. Without his generous support the rather special experience we enjoy in Kruger would not happen.

Head Teacher at Skukuza Primary School, **Jannie Geldenhuys** has been a feature since the first tour in 2002. Indeed on our second visit he acted as a guide on an evening game drive. He is very much involved in school sport in Mpumalanga Province, including athletics and of course, cricket. Remembered by all tourists for his delicious Potjie, a traditional dish introduced by the Voortrekkers in the



1880s, he has never forgiven Alan Swift for referring to it as a 'stew'.



Words cannot express our gratitude for the work **Isabel Geldenhuys** and **Petro Rossouw** have done to feed the hungry cricketers on each of

our visits. Petro is a police officer based in Skukuza and takes some of her annual leave to make sure we are all well catered for, while Isabel is a teacher at the local Skukuza Primary School.



It is incredible to think that this year will be the 18th year that the Roussouw and Geldenhuys families have been so kindly hosting us in the Kruger; in that time their children have grown up and so are now involved with looking after us too; **Jean Roussouw** had a season at Heathcoat CC, continues to play cricket at a high level in South Africa as well as being the captain of Skukuza Golf Club. His younger sister **Anica**, who is now a teacher also helps us. **Jandre Geldenhuys** is now a professional game driver and has been kind enough to take us on our game drives for the last two years and his younger brother, **Henco** umpires some of our games at Skukuza CC.

Referred to as the 'Mother City', a major world tourist destination, boasting spectacular Table Mountain as a backdrop and with more cricket grounds per square mile than you can believe.



The introduction to **Nabeal Dien** through Roger Newman in 2001 turned out to be the crucial link for future tours to Cape Town and the subsequent

establishment of a successful development exchange programme. Nabeal is now Chief Executive of Western Province Cricket Association and we are incredibly grateful for his continuing support and involvement in the tour.

Michelle Ernstzen - a delightful and capable lady who is PA to Nabeal at Newlands. She has a good working knowledge of



the youth structure in Western Province and has been a crucial and reliable link since the first tour in 2002.



'Mr Fixit' - **Shaheem** has organised our transport in and around Cape Town for every tour. A lively and very likeable character, he spent some years teaching at secondary level in Cape Town and is fondly remembered by all boys who have been on the tour. To the tour management, he is much more than simply the transport man, as he is full of ideas and appears to know everyone and everything that is happening in Cape Town. A streetwise and caring individual, he helps ensure that the boys have an enjoyable and safe time.



Mutual Benefit

A by-product of the annual tour has been the emergence of a Development Exchange Programme providing players (generally around the age of 19) from South Africa to play in Devon whilst players from Devon have spent part of the English winter playing cricket in the Western Province club league.

Of the current contracted Cape Cobras, 5 have had a season developing their cricket in the Devon League. In 2016, Kyle Verreyne, fresh from representing South Africa U19s and having played for Western Province U15s against Devon a few years

earlier, came to play for North Devon CC in the Devon Premier League. Kyle finished third highest run scorer in the league and scored three hundreds. Since returning to South Africa, he has scored his maiden first class century for Western Province CC and broken into the Cape Cobras team. Jason Smith, who also came over to play in the Devon League as an 18 year old five years ago (and holds the record Devon Premier League opening partnership with Barney Huxtable), is currently a regular in the Cape Cobras team. J P Duminy, Vernon Philander and Beuran Hendricks have all gone on to represent South Africa after spending time

playing in the Devon League as young adults.

In addition, young cricketers from Cape Town schools have been coming over to schools in Devon to further their cricket and academic development. Simon Weale, Headmaster of Shebbear College, adds "I first became aware of Devon's U15 tour to South Africa when my son was fortunate enough to be picked in 2015. This was a wonderful experience for him and under Alan Swift's guidance he came back a more resilient character and a better cricketer. As a result of the tour I was able to foster a link with Rondebosch High School and the Newlands Cricket Academy – two remarkable institutions that both help promote cricketing excellence in Cape Town. These exchanges can be arranged remarkably easily if people have the will to do so. As a result we have been able to

welcome cricketers from both schools to Shebbear (and to both North Devon and Hatherleigh CC's) and in January 2017 two Shebbear students undertook an eight-week stint at Newlands. There is so much more to this experience than a cricket tour. The boys will be treated as guests rather than tourists and, if their minds are open, their lives will be changed forever."

In the English 2017/18 winter, following in the footsteps of previous Devon players, James Burke and Max Curtis and tour graduates, Jack Dart and Tom Ansell, who both represented Devon CCC in the Minor Counties Championship, played for clubs in Cape Town in the Western Province cricket league.

Frustratingly, there is one current fly in the ointment to all this good work - the new UK Visa rules; once a talented young player has represented Western Province U17s or South Africa U17s, he is considered to be on a "pathway" to becoming a professional cricketer and so can no longer enter the UK to play cricket on a sports visitor visa, but neither can he enter with a professional sports Visa until he has played a certain number of first class fixtures. This means that the young South African players who most benefit from this exchange programme, namely talented 18-20 year olds who have recently left school, cannot come to the UK to play club cricket at the moment. Hopefully these crazy new rules will change soon.

evenings deciding what and where to eat each night. The sights, smells and sounds were quite over-powering.

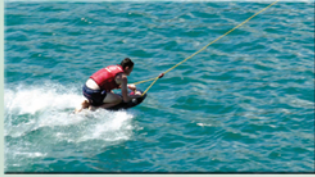
