Devon Cricket Development

Tour to South Africa

As I write this in the non-stop rain of a miserable English November, the thought of February in South Africa is very appealing ...

I would like to start my introduction to the brochure for the 2020 tour to South Africa by recognising the enormous contribution to Devon cricket of the tour's founder, Alan Swift. Not only did Alan create the tour, but he then ran it every year for fifteen years until 2016 as a volunteer, a quite extraordinary contribution to the development of young cricketers. Alan has built up a superb network of supporters of the tour both in the Kruger and in Cape Town, to the extent that they consider it just as an important part of their cricket year as we do. As the 2020 touring party, we are some of the lucky beneficiaries of Alan's tireless work.

This is the fourth year that I shall be managing the tour, having stepped into Alan's shoes to take it on for a few years. I have done so because I have seen at first hand, both as a parent and as part of the tour management, what a wonderful opportunity this tour is for 14 Devon boys to develop both as cricketers and as people. The last 2 years



have been especially exciting for the Tour - we have had our first graduates play

for England, and not just one but THREE! Firstly Craig Overton has now played in both home and away Ashes series; his first Test wicket on the 2017/18 Ashes Tour to

Australia was Australian captain and at the time world no.1 batsman, Steve Smith.

The second was Dominic Bess who made his debut at Lords in the 2018 Test Series against Pakistan, where he also performed well, scoring a half century on debut and taking his maiden Test wicket. Then in November this year Lewis Gregory made his debut for England in New Zealand, becoming only the second bowler for England to take a wicket with his first delivery in T20.

For all three of them, their first overseas representative tour was this Tour. In addition to these three, the current high-achieving Somerset CC squad has Craig's twin brother Jamie Overton, Tom Lammonby and Ben Green. All of them will tell you what a significant part of their cricket development the tour to South Africa was.

Thank you to all of you who have made a contribution towards the tour either by sponsorship or volunteering and to the rest of the tour coaching and management party - Nigel Ashplant, Paul Heard, Jack Bradbury, John Smith and Kat Hampton. I would also like to say a particular public thank you to Chris Gregson, father of 2016 tour captain James, who very kindly gives up his time as a solicitor free of charge to put together the Affidavits required by the South African Government for the boys to travel without their parents.

I hope we can make it another great tour to remember.

"The principal reason for travelling 6000 miles is to provide you with an opportunity to widen your cricket experience through playing against capable and competitive opponents in unfamiliar conditions. Nobody can demand that you must win every match you play - that has not happened on any of the previous tours! What we do ask is that you always strive to realise your potential to the benefit of yourself and the team. The cricket will certainly add an extra layer of experience to your development as a young player. How much you benefit will depend

on the extent that you want to learn and improve. Good coaches can help but ultimately the desire has to come from within. Nobody can learn for you!

Don't be too insular either as an individual or a group. Take the opportunity to talk to people you meet and gain some insight into their way of life and the contrasting cultures. If you do, South Africa and its people will repay you with interest."

With new coaches and a few new faces in our Devon under 14s squad we were excited for the summer ahead. Before that though we had six winter net sessions where we worked hard and prepared as a team. Both Jack and Nigel made the whole squad aware of the importance of the summer and the need for us to qualify for the ECB national competition in Division One for next year. We had plenty of ambition and drive to be successful and achieve the season's goal.



We started the summer with a friendly at a familiar venue, Kings College. We batted first on a

nice day on pitch 1 and Jake Pascoe was the star of the show scoring a fine 78 helping us to a competitive total of 221 in our 40 overs. This score proved too strong, as with good disciplined bowling from everyone - myself with 4 wickets and Jacob Koppambil taking 2, we knocked them over 110 runs short of the target.

We began our ECB competition with a long away trip to Berkshire. We let them get away from us early and on a good deck and a fast outfield, they made the most of a good start and went on to score an impressive 296. Harry Passenger was the pick of the bowlers with 1-36 off his 10. We got off to a decent start before the rain fell wetting the outfield and making the pitch harder to bat on. We ended up falling well short of our target despite resistance and fight from

Jake (36), Lawrence Walker (38) and Harry with an unbeaten 36.

Our second game was at Abbotskerswell where we played Wiltshire. I decided to bat first and put a score on the board. We got off to a brilliant start with an opening partnership of 86 before I fell for 31. Jake and Lawrence both played beautifully in an impressive partnership of 93 before Jake's exceptional innings came to an end 14 runs short of his maiden Devon ton. Absolutely plum! Lawrence's fine knock (70) came to an end shortly after leaving us 222-3. Helpful contributions from both Alec Holifield (28) and Troy Dos Santos (32*) gave us a final total of 312. We continued the good work in the form of early wickets thanks to our solid opening pair Alec and Ed Butler. Their number 4 scored an impressive 100, which gave them a chance, but Teddy Haffenden produced a master class dismissing him and then going on to take another wicket to win us the game by a comfortable 78 runs. Ed also took a 4fer showing his class and doing what he does best.

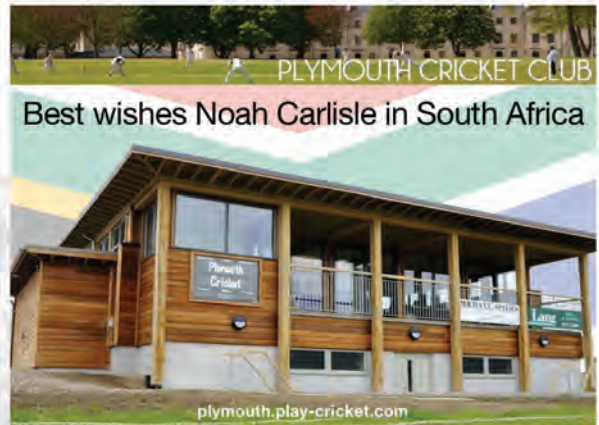
Following our win at Wiltshire we went to Taunton school where we met Somerset. I won the toss on a gloomy day and put them into bat on a greenish pitch. An early breakthrough from Ed and a run out from Jake left Somerset 42 -3. They went on to make 214-7 with Matt Jeacock bowling well picking up 2 wickets and Ed once again leading the way taking 3. Unfortunately, none of our top 5 really got going with Lawrence (19) making a start. It was looking like a heavy defeat before Harry Passenger walked out at number 8 and produced a remarkable innings -scoring 85 which included five 4s and two 6s. Despite Harry's brilliant knock we fell 64 runs short and left disappointed not to have done more.

Before the King's festival we were at Cornwood for our ECB game against Cornwall. Desperate to arrive at Kings and much to Jake's disappointment, I decided to bowl first on a good deck with the sun beaming down. At 42-1 I was starting to feel a bit worried about my decision, however moments later Alec had a blistering spell breaking the back of the Cornwall line up taking 4 wickets. I then chipped in with 4 of my own wickets finishing with 4-11 off my 6 overs. They ended up with 110 and Jake wasted no time in getting to 50, Lawrence with 23 and myself with 14* alongside Jake



58*, which took us over line in under 22 overs.

It was then straight to Kings,



a week which no cricketer wants to miss. All the boys were buzzing and ready to go on that Monday morning after the inevitable brilliant night's sleep everyone got. It was a fine morning on pitch 3 for our opening game against Cricmax USA and I won the toss and elected to bat first. Jake, once again contributed with 28 at the start of the innings. Lawrence played brilliantly for his 57 and myself (41) and Harry (46) also played well. Teddy (36*) and Noah Rider (25) ended the innings in some style helping us to 266-8 in our 50 overs. Ed led the way and bowled a beautifully controlled and deadly 10 overs giving him the just rewards of 4 excellent wickets. It was then Teddy's turn to get in on the action bowling well and picking up 3 well-deserved wickets for his spell of 3-31 off 8. Our strong bowling attack as a whole left Cricmax USA well short at 202-9.

After losing the toss on the second day we were bowling first and our opponents, Buckinghamshire got off to a solid start at 50 without loss. It took a little bit of magic

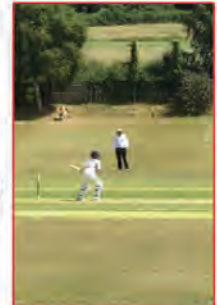

Harry ended with exceptional figures of 4-20 off 10. We were unable to quickly wrap it up and they reached 176 before we had them all out. Most of the top 5 in our innings made starts but were unable to make the most of them. Regular wickets cost us and we were eventually bowled out for 105. This was the most disappointing defeat of our season for me.

It was then Gloucestershire on the Wednesday and the boys were well up for the game. I lost the toss and we were bowling first again. We had a much-changed batting line up giving opportunities to everybody in the squad. Ed (15) and Harry (19) were the only notable scores as we started the game poorly. At least we all backed up and ran well! Once more it was star man Jake Pascoe who scored yet another half century and Zach Dunn with an important 28 who rescued us to a respectable total of 150. Shropshire played well and got off to a good start, but unfortunately despite Harry's 2 wickets we were unable to get them all out and they cruised to a 7 wicket win.

The final day against Oxfordshire was a wash out, sadly ending our festival early. We still had work to do in order to qualify for division one next year and a win at



Dorset would be vital. I won the toss and on a good day I decided to bat first. We were without leading run scorer Jake and Alec was unable to bat so we faced an uphill task. New opening partnership Zach and Teddy got us off to an assured start getting us to 30 without loss. However two quick wickets brought me to the crease at number 4. At 92-4 Troy Dos Santos came to join and we put on 71 before he eventually fell for 26. I was on 72* when Ed arrived and smashed a very entertaining 33 off just 22 balls which included four 6s. Devon century ending unbeaten on 108. In reply Dorset fell 80 runs short of our target, mostly down to Noah Carlisle's excellent glove work, not conceding a single bye and Ed, Jacob and Matt picking up 2 wickets each and myself taking 3.

The Hampshire game was washed out and a defeat against Gloucestershire despite some good bowling from Matty (2-12 off 5) and Harry (2-18 off 10) left us needing victory in our last game against Oxfordshire to secure our place in Division One.

I lost the toss and we were put into bat. We got off to a decent start at 118-2 before a mini collapse left us 122-5. Big Will Warren who had missed the whole season due to injury was brought into the side for the last game. He showed what a massive asset he is to the team as he smashed a quick 33. Since the first Devon Cricket Development tour in 2002, over two hundred young cricketers from Devon have visited South Africa and, judging by the very positive feedback, have derived great benefit from the experience. There is little doubt that the opportunity to play against capable and competitive opponents in unfamiliar circumstances has contributed to their cricket education.



However, while cricket development is the principal reason for travelling 6000 miles, it would be wrong to measure all the

A by-product of the annual tour has been the emergence of a Development Exchange Programme providing players (generally around the age of 19) from South Africa to play in Devon whilst players from Devon have spent part of the English winter playing cricket in the Western Province club league.

Of the 2019/20 Cape Cobras contracted squad, 4 have had a season developing their cricket in the Devon League (Vernon Philander, Zubayr Hamza, Jason Smith and Kyle Verreynne). In 2016 Kyle Verreynne, fresh from representing South Africa U19's

and having played for Western Province U15's against Devon a few years earlier, came to play for North Devon Cricket Club in the Devon Premier League, finishing third highest run scorer in the league and scoring three hundreds. Since his return to South Africa he has become first choice keeper for the Cobras. Jason Smith, who also came over to play in the Devon League as an 18 year old six years ago (and holds the record Devon Premier League opening partnership with Barney Huxtable), is also a regular in the Cape Cobras team. J P Duminy, Vernon Philander and Beuran Hendricks all

went on to represent South Africa after spending time playing in the Devon League as young adults.



Over recent years several young Devon players, after their great experiences on the tour as 15

year olds, have returned to Cape Town after leaving school to play league cricket in Western Province for a season or two and then gone on to play for Devon CCC in the Minor Counties Championship; such as James Burke, Max Curtis, Jack Dart and Tom Ansell.

In August this year township club Fish Rite Hanover Park CC led by the tireless Ashraf Allie, brought a young development team to play in Birmingham and Devon – the enthusiasm of these young players was a lesson to our more privileged youngsters.

In addition, young cricketers from Cape Town have been coming over to schools in Devon to further their cricket and academic development. Simon Weale, until recently Headmaster of Shebbear College, adds “I first became aware of Devon’s U15 tour to South Africa when my son was fortunate enough to be picked in 2015. This was a wonderful experience for him and under Alan Swift’s guidance he came back a more resilient character and a better cricketer. As a result of the tour I was able to foster a link

with Rondebosch High School and the Newlands Cricket Academy – two remarkable institutions that both help promote cricketing excellence in Cape Town. These exchanges can be arranged remarkably easily if people have the will to do so. As a result we have been able to welcome cricketers from both schools to Shebbear (and to both North Devon and Hatherleigh CC’s) and several Shebbear students have undertaken stints at Newlands. There is so much more to this experience than a cricket tour. The boys will be treated as guests rather than tourists and, if their minds are open, their lives will be changed forever.”

Frustratingly, there is one current fly in the ointment to all this good work – the current UK Visa rules; once a talented young player has represented Western Province U17’s or South Africa U17’s, he is considered to be on a “pathway” to becoming a professional cricketer and so can no longer enter the UK to play cricket on a sports visitor visa, but neither can he enter with a professional sports Visa until he has played a certain number of first class fixtures. This means that exactly the young South African players who most benefit from this exchange programme, namely talented 18-20 year olds who have recently left school, cannot come to the UK to play club cricket at the moment. Hopefully these crazy rules will change soon!

The next day, we had a training session at Skukuza cricket club, the heat made simple tasks like warming up very difficult but the excitement of playing in such an environment helped us get through the tough times.



The first game saw Rudolph Academy play Devon. The home side won the toss and put Devon into bat. Devon were bowled out for 166 thanks to a 50 from Ciaran Gray and 39 from Sam Russell. Myself and James Rowe both picked up wickets in our opening spell and some economic bowling from Josh Couch helped restrict the Academy 28 runs short of their target.

The next game was the 'Battle of Kruger' v Nelspruit High School. The home side took full advantage of some average bowling, putting on 191, with Rory Medlock picking up figures of 3-39. The openers James Hayter and Reuben Windley built a commendable partnership of 43, however a quick collapse led to 90 runs needed but with only 4 wickets remaining at the end of day 1. Day 2 saw Devon needing to bat out for a draw which they achieved thanks to some dogged batting from Sammy Broomhead

who faced 100 balls and Reuben Windley who faced 70. Nelspruit's inability to bowl out Devon meant the trophy stayed with Devon who left the Kruger the following day for Cape Town.

Arriving at the ground just a few hours after touching down at Cape Town International Airport was not particularly beneficial to the touring side in a one off T20 against SACS High School. The home side won the toss and elected to bat first. Some good fielding and bowling restricted Devon to a below par score but Sam Russell showed some resistance, hitting a quick 39 which included two sixes. The task for Devon was then to defend 98. It started off well for the visitors, with Tom Hatton taking the wicket of their captain on the very first ball of the innings. However, it was all downhill after that as some very aggressive hitting helped SACS chase the total in just 13 overs.

A well-needed rest day saw Devon travel to Robben Island. The boat journey out gave the team a beautiful view of Cape Town and Table Mountain. The Island itself contained the prison cell where Nelson Mandela was imprisoned under the charge of 'high treason' against the state. The excursion helped educate the team on the wider history of South Africa, most notably apartheid.

In a first for many of the team, the next game to be played was a day/night fixture against Bergvliet High School. Devon won the toss and elected to bat; a mixture of

looked doubtful as to whether Devon would win, but Josh Couch hit a 6 in the final over - match tied and it went to a super over. Devon put on a respectable total of 8, and some tidy bowling meant the home side lost by 5 runs.

After the game, Devon went up the famous Table Mountain to see the sunset. The views from the top were amazing and with such clear weather the visibility was incredibly high.

Next up the 2 day game at WPCC against Western Province Under 14s, who won the toss and elected to bat. They made 172 all out, Rory Medlock picking up superb figures of 6-18. Despite this strong bowling, Devon’s batting wasn’t quite of the same standard, getting bowled out for 86. Demonstrating the strength of the opposition, Archie Farkins was the top scorer with 31. Western Province’s second innings saw them put on 198 (declared), 43 of which came from top scorer Fa Davis. In spite of an impressive attempt from Devon, with James Hayter top scoring with 31, Devon failed in the run chase.

After two hard days of cricket, a much needed rest and recuperation period was spent at the Blue Rock quarry, which had plenty on offer to keep us entertained. There was kneeboarding, water skiing and a great place to “tombstone” off the rocks. Mark Ansell, tour organiser, said it was the first time on tour that the entire team had tombstoned. Great participation! In addition

to this, we were also pleased to see the penguins on Boulders Beach on another one of our many day trips.



The final game of the tour was a 50 over game against Western Province Under 15s. The big game got off to a good start with Jasper Presswell winning the toss and electing to bowl first. The home side put on a solid total of 219, kept down by some good bowling efforts by myself (3-11) and Jasper Presswell (2-36). Devon’s chasing attempts looked doubtful after early wickets but the tail wagged and a very well constructed innings of 46 from Josh Couch meant Devon needed just 10 off the last over for Devon to record their first ever victory in the 18 years of the tour over Western Province U15’s. Unfortunately it was not to be, as Devon were bowled out for 210. The match finished with the traditional kind gesture of both teams swapping hats and tour kit.

All in all, I would summarise the tour as being a thoroughly enjoyable and well organised event. It was a fantastic opportunity to visit a part of the world which I wouldn’t have ordinarily travelled to and I would encourage anybody with the means to do so to visit. Best of luck to the touring team from Devon in 2020.
