There's also much more to the tour than cricket. Players get to see South Africa's wildlife, meet local people, and experience different ways of life. These moments help them grow into more well-rounded people.




#### Alan Swift encourages players to embrace every aspect of the trip:





When the Devon Cricket Tour first ventured into the wilds of South Africa in 2002, few could have imagined the enduring bond that would form between a group of young cricketers from England and our community nestled within the Kruger National Park. As a Senior Ranger here at the time, I had the privilege of initiating contact with Alan Swift, laying the groundwork for what has become a cherished annual tradition.

Skukuza, our home base, is more than just a rest camp; it's a vibrant village teeming with life, both human and wild. Skukuza Cricket Club, situated in the heart of our staff village, offers a unique playing experience where the boundaries are shared with the untamed bush. For most cricketers, the idea of sharing

a pitch with Africa's Big Five roaming just beyond the boundary rope seems like something out of a dream, but in Skukuza, this is simply the norm.

Skukuza Cricket Club is unlike any other in the world. Surrounded by the wilderness of the Kruger, this ground offers a unique combination of sport and safari. There are no stands filled with spectators here, just trees, bushveld, and occasionally the odd impala grazing near the boundary. It's not uncommon for games to be paused while elephants amble past or for players to spot giraffes from the pavilion. The sight of monkeys inspecting kit bags or warthogs trotting across the outfield is all part of the experience.

This is cricket in its wildest form, both literally and figuratively. For young cricketers from Devon, playing in Skukuza won't just be about runs and wickets. It'll be about memories, perspective, and respect for nature.

#### **MY JOURNEY**

Over the years, the Devon boys have become part of our extended family. My wife, Petro, has taken on the role of team chef during their stays, preparing hearty meals that fuel their adventures both on and off the field. Her dedication ensures that the team experiences not just the thrill of the game but also the warmth of our hospitality.

Our son, Jean, has enjoyed this cross-continental camaraderie. Through the initial exchange programme set up by Alan, he spent time playing at Heathcoat Cricket Club, immersing himself in English cricket culture. Today, Jean serves as the head greenkeeper at the Skukuza Golf Club, renowned as the wildest golf course in the world. With no fences, the course is a haven for wildlife, and Jean's mornings often begin with ensuring the fairways are clear of any overnight animal activity.

Having grown up in South Africa and served for many years with SANParks, particularly in the Anti-Rhino Poaching Unit, I've come to know the Kruger National Park not only as a conservation area but as a living, breathing ecosystem filled with stories, danger, and beauty.

My life's work has been dedicated to combating wildlife crime. I've led efforts against rhino poaching, a relentless threat to our precious biodiversity. Collaborating with international figures like Kevin Pietersen and organizations such as SORAI, we've strived to protect these majestic creatures. I was also featured in a BBC documentary alongside Prince Harry, highlighting the grim realities of poaching and our ongoing battle to preserve wildlife.

My role was never just about protecting rhinos, it was about preserving a way of life, a piece of our natural heritage under threat from greed and exploitation.

The work is often dangerous. Poachers are desperate and heavily armed. We had to be more than just rangers; we were trackers, strategists, and at times, soldiers. Many long nights were spent on patrol, listening to the sounds of the bush, trying to distinguish between natural rhythms and signs of illegal activity. And through it all, the one constant was our love for this land, its silence, its sudden roars, and its uncanny ability to remind you how small you really are.

#### A GLIMPSE INTO THE WILD

For the Devon squad, the Kruger experience will be more than just a couple of cricket fixtures, it'll be a journey into the soul of Africa. The park is home to over 140 species of mammals and more than 500 species of birds. From the haunting call of a fish eagle at dawn to the stealthy prowl of a leopard at dusk, every moment here is rich with discovery.

Players might catch sight of herds of elephants crossing the Sabie River or lions lounging beneath the fever trees. Crocodiles and hippos occupy the riverbanks, and the early morning drives might reveal everything from lions on the hunt to elusive wild dogs darting through the scrub.

The young cricketers from Devon will not only train and play in one of the most unique locations on Earth, but

they'll leave with an understanding of conservation, culture, and connection to something far bigger than themselves. They'll hear stories around the braai (barbecue) fires, learn local traditions, and maybe even pick up a few words in Shangaan, the language spoken by many of the park's staff.

As someone who has lived and breathed this landscape, I can say with certainty: the Kruger changes you. It teaches patience and respect.

For the Devon U15s, this part of their South African journey will likely become one of their most treasured memories.

As we prepare to welcome the team once again, I am filled with gratitude for the memories we've created and the friendships that have blossomed. Here's to many more years of cricket under the African sun, where the spirit of the game thrives amidst the wild beauty of Kruger.

#### CRICKET IN SOUTH AFRICA: A JOURNEY THROUGH HISTORY

As we prepare for our 23rd tour of South Africa, we reflect not just on the opportunity to play cricket in one of the most spectacular and passionate sporting countries in the world, but also on the unique and complex history of the game in South Africa, a story that spans generations, geographies, and, at times, profound societal change.



Cricket was first introduced to South Africa in the early 19th century by British colonists, with the first recorded match played in 1808. By the late 1800s, South Africa had become the third Test-playing nation, after England and Australia, with its first Test match in 1889.

Early South African cricket was predominantly white and elite, rooted firmly within colonial

structures and separated from the vast majority of the population.

Despite this, the game was passionately embraced by all communities. Black, Coloured, and Indian South Africans formed their own clubs and associations under extremely limited circumstances, playing in segregated leagues, often with little to no resources, but with deep commitment and love for the game.

#### APARTHEID AND SPORTING ISOLATION

From 1948, apartheid entrenched racial segregation across all aspects of South African life, including sport. Cricket, like many other institutions, was divided along racial lines. Talented players of colour were systematically excluded from national selection, and entire communities were denied fair access to facilities, development pathways, and recognition.

In response to the injustice, the international cricket community eventually imposed a ban on South Africa, and from 1970 until 1991, the country was excluded from official

Test cricket. This period of sporting isolation became a powerful global symbol of resistance against apartheid, reinforcing the message that equality and fair play should extend beyond the boundary rope.

#### REINTEGRATION AND TRANSFORMATION

In 1991, with the dismantling of apartheid underway and Nelson Mandela soon to walk free, South Africa were welcomed back into the international fold. The country played its first post-isolation ODI against India in Kolkata that same year. Just a year later, South Africa competed in the 1992 World Cup, a tournament that

reintroduced the Rainbow Nation to the cricketing world.

But reintegration brought new challenges. The need to redress the past and ensure equal opportunities for players of all backgrounds led to the introduction of transformation policies, including quotas aimed at increasing representation from historically disadvantaged groups.

These remain a subject of debate within South African cricket, balancing the legacies of history with the demands of merit, fairness, and unity.

Today, South African cricket reflects a country still on a journey, one striving to reconcile its history while fostering a more inclusive and competitive future.

The nation has produced some of the greatest cricketers the world has seen, from Jacques Kallis to Makhaya Ntini, from AB de Villiers to Kagiso Rabada, players who have captivated fans across the globe.

Cricket in South Africa is as much about community as it is about elite performance. Townships, schools, and clubs across the country remain vibrant centres of grassroots cricket. Touring sides like Devon Under-15s are not just visiting a country with breathtaking scenery and rich wildlife, from the Kruger National Park to the Table Mountain coastline, they're stepping into a sporting culture shaped by resilience, hope, and an undying love for the game.

Some of my fondest and most formative memories in cricket began with a passport in my hand and a bag packed for tour. I still look back with huge gratitude on the opportunity I had to tour South Africa with the Devon Under-15s in 2011 and 2012. That was really where it all started for me.

I was lucky, I went a year early, which meant I got two cracks at it. Not many get that kind of opportunity. That first trip was eye-opening. The heat, the pitches, the quality of cricket, the culture, it was nothing like what I'd known back home in Sidmouth. But more than anything, it lit a fire in me. It gave me the sense that this was what I wanted to do. I came back knowing I wanted to be a professional cricketer.

Those tours didn't just help me improve on the field, they helped me grow off it. Being away from home at a young age, learning how to adapt, how to carry myself, how to play as a team and represent something bigger than myself, those lessons stick with me. Touring helped me mature quickly, and that's something I've carried with me all the way through.

I was fortunate to come through the Devon youth system, playing for Sidmouth and spending a bit of time at Exeter, before progressing into the Somerset Academy. Since then, I've gone on to play for Somerset and now Yorkshire, where I've just had the huge honour of captaining the four-day County Championship side, which was a really proud moment for me.

Along the way, there have been many more tours. I've spent time in Australia, including a spell at the Darren Lehmann Academy, where I really worked on refining my game and understanding what it takes to play at the top level. Then came the ultimate moment, being selected to tour with the England Test squad.

That took me back to South Africa in 2020, full circle from those first under-15 days. To walk out at Newlands in Cape Town and play a Test match for England was surreal. I'll never forget that feeling. Touring with the national side was everything you'd imagine, intense, exciting, challenging and I believe it was

all those early experiences on junior tours that laid the foundation for me to handle it.

Most recently, I spent the 2023-24 winter in Zimbabwe playing for the Southern Rocks. It was another brilliant experience, getting out of my comfort zone, playing in different conditions, learning about the world and myself at the same time. That passion for travelling and playing overseas, especially in Africa, has stayed with me.

For any young player reading this, embrace the tour. It's about more than just cricket. It's about resilience, independence, friendship, and seeing the world through the lens of sport. For me, every tour has added something: a new skill, a new perspective, or a renewed love for the game.

I owe a lot to those early tours with Devon. They helped shape the player and person I am today. And if you get the chance to tour, take it, you never know where that journey might lead.



#### **Head of Communications**

Working in sport and travelling the world while doing so has been something I have wanted to do since leaving university just over a decade ago. I have been privileged

enough to have now done the former for three years at the Devon Cricket Foundation as Head of Communications, and I am excited at the opportunity to fulfil the latter by going on this special tour. The Under 15 Boys Tour of South Africa is a stand out feature in the calendar at Devon Cricket, and I feel immensely privileged to have been asked to be a part of it.











For many young cricketers, the opportunity to represent their county on an overseas tour is their biggest dream come true. But for us, the upcoming Under 15 boys' tour to South Africa will be far more than a milestone, it will be a crucial developmental experience, purposefully placed in the pathway designed not just to continually identify talent, but to nurture young people through the game.

#### This isn't the final stop. It's the next step on a journey focused on holistic growth, long-term progression, and individual potential.

The South Africa tour will immerse players in a high-performance environment, exposing them to new challenges on and off the field. They will compete against strong opposition in unfamiliar conditions and experience cultural life vastly different from home. This experience will build resilience, adaptability, and leadership - qualities central to our Devon Cricket ethos.

"Having coaching on the 2015 and 2016 tours, some of the most powerful moments came off the pitch.

I remember one player in 2015 saying the experience made him feel more independent, more responsible and that he viewed himself differently. The cricket was outstanding, but the personal development was what really stuck with me."

"In 2016, our team really bonded in a way I hadn't seen before. Long travel days, hard matches, and shared moments created a depth of team spirit and maturity that carried back into the summer season. It wasn't about creating finished players, it was about laying down experiences they'd build from in future years."

#### A PATHWAY BUILT ON PURPOSE & PROGRESSION

The Devon Cricket Performance Pathway has been carefully designed to support players from early potential to high-level performance. It begins at Youth Development Cricket (YDC), progresses through County Age Group (CAG) squads, and for some, continues into the Emerging Player Programme (EPP).



At each stage, purpose and progression are key. Players are supported equally, roles are rotated, and multiformat cricket ensures all players can showcase and develop their skills.

Each stage serves a specific purpose:

- YDC (U11-U15): Focuses on enjoyment, skill exploration, and awareness of the game in a safe and developmental environment.
- CAG (U13-U18): Introduces more competitive elements, refined technical and tactical coaching, and wider match scenarios.
- EPP (U13+): Offers elite development for players with long-term potential, combining advanced training, physical preparation, and performance psychology.

Throughout, players are encouraged to be curious, resilient, and team-focused - values that underpin Devon's player development framework.

#### **RESIDENTIAL CAMPS**

Our Southwest Development Camps, held over three days for both boys and girls, are another cornerstone of the pathway. These camps provide young players with a chance to train at a higher level, live and learn alongside their peers, and build confidence away from home.

Here, cricket is only part of the journey. The camps are about self-management, communication, shared responsibility, and character development - all essential elements for players preparing to take the next steps in their sporting and personal lives.



#### **OVERSEAS TOURS**

Overseas tours to South Africa and Sri Lanka are not rewards for talent, they are opportunities for growth. Playing in new and different environments challenges players tactically and technically, but also emotionally and socially. It broadens horizons and deepens understanding of the world.

"The players who went on our tours in 2015 and 2016 came back changed, not just better cricketers, but more aware, more thoughtful young men. We're not just shaping cricketers, we're helping shape people who can contribute meaningfully wherever life takes them."





These experiences strengthen the county's cricketing culture. Players return to their clubs and schools with renewed energy, confidence, and leadership, inspiring others along the way.

Ultimately, Devon Cricket's Performance
Pathway is about far more than
performance. It is built to help young
people grow as complete individuals
- physically, mentally, emotionally and
socially. It recognises that success looks
different for every player, and that each
journey is unique.

Some will go on to national pathways or First-Class cricket. Others will captain their clubs, become coaches, or simply enjoy the game for life. All outcomes are celebrated.

#### SOUTH AFRICA IS JUST THE BEGINNING

As the Under-15 boys prepare to embark on their South African adventure, the message from Devon Cricket is clear: this is not the destination. It's a chance to challenge, to learn, to grow and to take another important step along a lifelong pathway.

Here in Devon, every step matters, and strive for every player to have the chance to find their potential.

#### ENDURING CRICKET FRIENDSHIP

When you think about long-distance friendships, few are as enduring and as cricket obsessed as the one between Devon and the Western Province Cricket Association. More than two decades on from its inception, it's a connection we are proud to continue fostering.

The journey started in 2002, when Alan Swift, who was then leading the Devon U15 cricket programme, connected with Roger Newman, a well-respected cricket mind, Academy Director at Warwickshire CCC at the time and later the first Director of Cricket at Oxford MCCU. He had strong ties with South Africa, and in particular, a man by the name of Nabeal Dien, then the General Manager of Western Province Cricket Association.

Originally, Alan had been exploring the idea of taking Devon's U15s on tour to Zimbabwe, he wanted players to experience something completely different, to see Africa and to be taken out of their comfort zone. But when the South Africa opportunity emerged through Roger and Nabeal, it was too good to pass up. The first Devon tour took place in 2002, and from that moment, our cricketing ties with Cape

Town and the Western Cape have never looked back.

Nabeal quickly became a central figure in making the tour what it is today. He helped organise fixtures, liaise with clubs, and essentially built an itinerary that allowed our boys to experience not only top-quality cricket but the vibrancy of South African life.

In return, a player exchange programme developed, Devon clubs would host talented young cricketers from South Africa for a season in England.

It's hard to overstate the impact of that initiative. Through Nabeal's connections



and drive, names like Vernon Philander, J.P. Duminy, Qaasim Adams, Craig Alexander, Dominic Telo, and most recently Kyle Verreynne came over to cut their teeth in the Devon Cricket League. These players brought with them not only talent, but a fierce passion for the game, and in turn, Devon cricket became richer for their presence. For many of our clubs, hosting these players was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, to learn from, train with, and compete alongside cricketers who would go on to represent their country on the world stage.

Alongside Nabeal, we must also mention Michelle Ernstien, his PA and secretary, who played a huge role in the day-to-day running of logistics, communications, and simply getting things done. Without Michelle, many of the smoother moments of those early tours wouldn't have been possible.

When Alan passed on the reins in 2014, Mark Ansell from North Devon Cricket Club picked up the baton. Mark, a stalwart of the David Shepherd Cricket
Trust and a passionate supporter of
youth development, ran the tour superbly
for the next six years. His relationship
with Nabeal ensured that the tour
kept its warmth, its character, and its
cricketing edge right up until Nabeal's
retirement in 2019.

Since then, the torch has passed to Matt Theedom and I. Matt has been involved with the Devon Cricket Foundation for nearly 20 years, and while I've moved on to pastures new from the working for the Foundation, I remain heavily involved in youth coaching and the development side of the game. Together, we've aimed to continue this legacy, modernising where needed, but staying true to the tour's heart and soul.

Naturally, the relationship has changed. It's now more professional than personal, but no less effective. Our thanks go out to Clinton du Preez, the Cricket Services Manager at Western Province Cricket, and to Camillah Adams, who leads much

of the youth cricket coordination across the region. Their dedication and support have been second to none. They work tirelessly to provide us with the very best venues, the strongest opposition, and a competitive yet welcoming environment for our boys to grow in.

Due to the increasing complexity of visa regulations in the UK, especially around the Tier 5 visa scheme, the exchange programme we once enjoyed so fruitfully is unfortunately much harder to sustain today. But while those logistics might be more difficult, the essence of the partnership remains. We still feel part of the Western Province cricketing family.

Since moving from February to October, it's opened up a new dimension: we now tour at the start of the South African season.

This gives local coaches a great chance to see their young players tested in match situations early in their season, almost like a trial period before competitive fixtures like their National "Coca Cola Week" begin. And for our lads? It's the challenge of playing in foreign conditions, against strong opposition, with the mountains of the Cape as a stunning backdrop.

So, as I write this, it's with a deep sense of gratitude. To Clinton, to Camillah, to all the clubs and coaches who host us, and of course to the trailblazers like Roger, Nabeal, and Alan who helped get this all started, you've all played a huge part in creating something really special. Long may it continue.

#### **MOTHER CITY**


